Clarice was born and bred in Sturton and never forgot her roots and happy times with her brothers and sisters, Harold (Gelder), Barbara (Butcher), Winifred (Davenport), Lilian (Curtis) and Bill.

Clarice trained as a teacher and worked at Ermine School in Lincoln, then in Malaya and Cyprus where she met and married Norman who died in 2020. They later moved to Skelton, York which became their permanent home after much travelling and working abroad.

Whenever they had the opportunity they returned to Sturton to stay with Barbara and later with nephew Denzil. Their time in Sturton was spent reminiscing and visiting old friends and places where Clarice grew up.




They were always interested in the changes within the village over the years and remembering Clarice's involvement with community activities including president and secretary of the Sturton and Stow Show.

This tram was built as a push go-cart running on recycled pram wheels. It was built around 1963 by pupils in the woodwork classes at Sturton by Stow Secondary School.

Steering was a tiller type and it could seat the driver and Andrew recalls it may be could seat two small passenger (but did not run very often).

The road at Stow has been altered since the photo was taken. This view is towards Willingham with the tram facing toward Sturton.


