#### Christmas Lights Competition

The Parish Council invite you to take part in the Christmas Lights Competition. There is no need to register your interest. If you would like to enter all you need to do is to have your lights up and switched on. The Christmas lights always bring cheer at this time of year. Judging will take place on 10 December.

#### **Community Speed Watch**

The group is still going strong and has recently enjoyed an influx of additional volunteers. They have just completed their mandatory training and are fully indemnified. We are also pleased to announce that a new location on Cowdale Lane in Bransby has been approved.

Each session, deployed in various parts of the village, has data uploaded to the Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership.

Since June this year we have recorded: 78 over 35mph, 43 over 40mph, 5 over 50mph and 1 over 60mph! Most of these were in the 30mph zones.

Each registered keeper will have received a letter stating when, where, what time and how fast the driver was going and be provided with advice. There has also been an additional six second letters sent out to drivers - hopefully they will not get a third and a visit from their local police force.

#### Its Not My Problem or Is It?

Parish Council are often contacted regarding problems with pavements, footpaths and roads (among other things). Whilst we cannot usually provide an immediate remedy (we do report as soon as possible) there is a way you can help.

If you see a problem such as potholes, overgrown hedging, lights not working or anything else which needs correcting you can now report online using Fix My Street, **www.fixmystreet.com**. This website sends your notification directly to either Lincolnshire County Council or West Lindsey District Council. It is a very easy system to navigate and if you can upload photographs of the problem, even better. By all means keep contacting Parish Council, but it may be quicker to use this website as well.

Parking – Sturton by Stow Primary School

Parish Council have been contacted about inconsiderate parking on School Lane. The grass next to School Lane and adjacent to Bradshaw's entrance is not a safe place to park. Our local PCSO will be making visits to ensure vehicles are parked in a safe manner.

These vehicles not only obstruct pedestrians, they ruin the grass verge and visibility for other traffic using School Lane is being compromised. Please do not be the one to cause a completely avoidable accident.

The safety of our children is paramount. Parking is always an issue in this location. If you can walk to and from school then we would urge you to do so.
