

This year is a big year for the Show – it will be our 135th.

The first Show was held in 1887 and it is still going strong. Most classes are open to everyone, not just local residents, and whether you are a gardener, a baker, a wine maker, a painter, a jam maker, good at sewing or craftwork and making things or an aspiring photographer, there will be a class for you to enter. In addition, there will be a classic car display, tractors, engines and local stalls and displays. The Youth Club provides refreshments on the day including their very popular bacon rolls!

Are your entries going to be ready? What about that prize piece of fruit? Those king size vegetable? Or have you been practising your cake baking? Or did you while away those winter evenings at your needlework or crafts? Or is it that bottle of wine or fruit gin? Maybe it is your artwork or that special photograph you took? The Show is built on the talents of residents and their willingness to enter the various classes – so why not play a part? It is great fun, but a word of warning – it can become addictive!

To commemorate the Platinum Jubilee the Show committee donated a planter each to Sturton and to Stow and these are now in place.

## Riparian Rights and Responsibilities

n the 10<sup>th</sup> March, in the Village Hall, the Parish Council organised an open public information event, around the subject of the drainage dykes, ditches and culverts which are intended to keep our village free from surface flooding.

As well as representatives from the Parish Council, present were delegates from Lincolnshire County Council, The Environment Agency, The Internal Drainage Board, and the National Flood Forum. With maps and charts depicting all known local watercourses, residents were invited to come along and see them, and find out where culverts and ditches on their land might require them to provide regular clearance and maintenance.

It was good to welcome some 20-30 villagers (more would have been even better!), some of them with intimate and historical knowledge of just where some un-marked flows went. It was of great interest to hear about now long-gone ponds, which would have had a useful impact in years gone by.

The National Flood Forum provided guidance as to the help and advice on offer to residents who have experienced flooding, including how to gain access to reasonably-priced house insurance. We all have something which we can do to reduce flooding risk in Sturton by Stow, even if a watercourse does not flow through our garden: planting more trees, keeping our driveways permeable, reporting blocked drains etc.

As a result of the event, a plan of action has been developed. The LCC Flood Risk Officer and colleagues from the Witham Internal Drainage Board shall be making a site visit in May, to inspect areas particularly identified as being of concern. Asset maps are being updated, and residents of Saxilby Road will be particularly informed about the watercourse flowing towards Marton Road. A leaflet for all residents is nearing completion.

Interested residents are encouraged to volunteer their services to the National Flood Forum, via the Parish Council, so as to form an independent Flood Action Group that could deal with any future emergencies.
