Flooding investigations in the village

Lincolnshire County Council (LCC) are currently undertaking investigative works into the flooding issues following storms Babet and Henk. Flood risk consultants started engaging with residents affected on 4th March 2024 and will be continuing for several more months.

Recording of the flood information from residents is being completed via our online questionnaire. These are either being completed by our consultants in person where residents are at home, or by the resident via a QR coded letter that is being left at the property if the resident is not home at the time of visiting. Thus ensuring that as many residents as possible are able to provide their information on what occurred during the flooding events.

Although the questionnaire is aimed at those internally affected please feel free to submit a questionnaire highlighting areas of concern within the village in regards to flooding.

Dwellings on Queensway, which were subject to flooding during last winter, have been fitted with floodgates to help ensure a repeat situation does not arise. After investigation works by Acis and West Lindsey (Cllr Lynda Mullally), Acis has fitted all the properties which are at risk of future flooding events with the easy-to-use gates. Any hint of rising water and the gates are simply slotted into place.

Sturton by Stow and Stow Neighbourhood Plan

The minor modifications review of our Neighbourhood Plan is now complete and has been approved by West Lindsey. The new version will be published on West Lindsey Planning and our respective parish council's websites. The respective representatives of Sturton by Stow and Stow spent the last year rewriting and liaising with the Neighbourhood Planning Officer of West Lindsey. This minor modification plan is valid until 2036 but will need to be reviewed in line with Central Lincolnshire Local Plan. This will mean an undertaking of reviewing at least every five years. The plan will be used by parish councillors to help form responses to planning applications within the parishes of Sturton by Stow and Stow.



Community Speed Watch

The local Community Speed Watch group is continuing its activities monitoring the speed of traffic in Sturton by Stow and in Bransby. In particular many



vehicles are still exceeding the speed limit on the section of Tillbridge Road that was reduced from 40 mph to 30 mph in the summer. If a vehicle is recorded travelling at 35 mph or higher in a 30 mph zone the registered keeper will receive a letter detailing what was recorded and offering advice.

A training session was held in July and we now have four new volunteers and we have also had three new locations approved by the Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership so we are now able to put on more sessions across Sturton by Stow and Bransby.

However, we are always looking for more volunteers to join our group so if you have an hour or two to spare each month you would be made most welcome (full training and equipment is provided).
