

Fix my Street

- Shingles spilt on Saxilby Road- NO ACTION
 - Leak on the verge of 20 Tillbridge Road- FIXED
 - Bradway to Upper Close and Upper Close to Fleets Road are in poor condition. Two of which are subject to flooding. Reported to Fix My Street- Being assessed. No update yet.

- The wet pour maintenance could not be carried out as expected as with current high temperatures the rubber would not cure. The wet pour maintenance for the village hall playpark is still scheduled for a dry day. A playpark closed sign has been prepared and a temporary lock will be arranged to secure the playpark whilst the wet pour is drying. Hopefully Tuesday 30th June.

- The first cut of Jubilee Wood was due this month w/c 22nd June, unfortunately the weather was too hot- hopefully the cut will take place on Saturday.
- Owl Box update- The wood has been ordered and is ready for collection- Mens Sheds have been informed.
- The Trent Supercluster is a clean energy and innovation hub centered on three former coal sites, West Burton, High Marnham, and Cottam. It is placing the East Midlands/ Lincolnshire at the cutting edge of clean energy and high-tech innovation – including nuclear, green hydrogen, and data centers. The supercluster spans approximately 14 miles along the River Trent in Nottinghamshire close to West Lindsey. It is already home to the UK Government's world-leading Spherical Tokamak for Energy Production (STEP) fusion prototype and the UK's largest green hydrogen production facility. Starting next week, Bassetlaw District Council on behalf of the East Midlands Combined County Authority (EMCCA) will be launching Know Your Place Trent Valley (KYPTV). KYPTV is a community engagement approach that is looking to build understanding of local communities either side of the River Trent across parts of four local authority areas - Bassetlaw, West Lindsey, Newark and Sherwood, and North Kesteven. The data collected from these conversations will be published and used to help create local profile reports that will help define local priorities and to inform decisions makers regarding emerging projects such as the Trent Supercluster. --Posters have been displaying on the notice boards, social media and website and a leaflet drop with the upcoming newsletter.
